Q. Who may use the Digital Estate Planning solution?

A. Our Digital Estate Planning solution is available to you and your legally married spouse when you, the employee, are enrolled in Optional Term Life. The process is designed to work for most people, but if there are aspects of your estate that are more complicated, you might be directed to reach out to one of our network attorneys instead of using the online process.

Q. In what states is Online Notary available?

A. Online Notary is available to you if you reside in one of the following 24 states:
Alabama, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Idaho, Illinois, Kansas, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Montana, North Dakota, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, Nevada, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Washington Wisconsin and Wyoming.

Q. How do I access the online estate planning solution?

A. All you need to do is visit legalplans.com/estateplanning and follow the online instructions. You will need to create an account using the email and password of your choice.

Q. Can I still access the in-person Will Preparation service⁴?

A. Yes. If you are eligible for MetLife's Will Preparation services today, you will continue to be able to work with an attorney directly for your estate planning needs.

Online Notary is not included with basic or dependent life. Digital Estate Planning without online notary is available to all individuals regardless of any MetLife relationship or product, except those residing in GU, PR and VI.
